

# What's the alternative?

Could getting wired up with a Bicom Resonance treatment be the cure for all ills? Dawn Mellowship checks it out

viruses within my body.

Once the diagnosis had been established Peter set up the machine to treat my kidneys, apparently the main causal factor in my illnesses. I wondered if this could be too good to be true – a machine that diagnoses and cures all your ills. I sat holding a big brass electrode across my front whilst another was strapped to my kidneys, preparing to be sparked up! Peter assured me that I should feel something happening instantly and bizarrely enough I did feel a tingling in my kidneys and the pain I had in that region began to gradually ease off. The Bicom device is said to pick up all the frequencies within the particular organ or cells being treated. The healthy frequencies are amplified and played back into the body. The negative frequencies are reversed or inverted to neutralise the disease.

Following the treatment Peter prescribed me some alcohol based homeopathic remedies and gave me some nutritional advice to follow. When I came away from the treatment my kidneys did feel slightly less painful and I felt more energised.
